In music we will be focussing on:

Plants

- Identify and describe the functions of different parts of plants
- Explore the needs of plants for life and growth
- Explore the role of flowers in the life cycle of flowering plants

- What might hill forts have looked like when they were first built?
- How do we know that life wasn't always peaceful in the Iron Age?
